Present Perfect

NEVER

We use the present perfect **to talk about experiences** – something you have done at some time in your life before now, **but we don't say exactly when.**



I **have visited** London.
She **has eaten** sushi.



I **haven't been** to Tokyo.
He **hasn't travelled** abroad.



Have you ever **visited** London?
Has she ever **tried** dim sum?
